ROTARY WANDERINGS - ROYSTON FLUDE




Sarah and Royston

Royston Flude presented to the club at our meeting on Thursday December 12th, 2019.

Royston has a strong history with the Rotary Club. Starting off as a Rotaractor in Lymm in 1974, he then went on to join the Rotary Club of Lymm, becoming President in 1987-88, joined the Rotary Club of Manchester and was President 2000-01. Work took him to Switzerland where he became a Charter member of the Genève International Club in 2015, Fellowship Chair of Rotary International Educators 2019-20, and has recently rejoined the Rotary Club of Manchester.

Royston's achievements are truly an inspiration and it was motivational for us to look towards a vision that contributes to the betterment of the world.

THE TOAST - QUEEN, DUKE OF LANCASTER THE LOYAL TOAST IN LANCASHIRE

Henry of Grosmont, the Earl of Lancaster was, in 1351, rewarded by King Edward III for his great services in the French Wars by the conferment of the second Dukedom in English history and by the elevation of Lancashire into a County Palatine on the model of Chester.

When, in 1399, the grandson of Henry of Grosmont became King of England as Henry IV, the Duchy and its rights remained a separate entity under the Crown. This arrangement was maintained by Edward IV in 1461 when the House of Lancaster had lost the throne and has continued ever since. As in peerage law a woman could not exercise the full rights to a Dukedom (e.g. sitting in Parliament) and since the Sovereign could not by definition be limited in the exercise of the rights of any of it appanages (e.g. Duchy of Lancaster, Duchy of Cornwall) a Queen Regnant has to be described as Duke and not Duchess of Lancaster.

As Lancashire is still a County Palatine, it is, therefore, appropriate in this Shire to recall the fact that the Duchy of Lancaster has still a separate entity not merged in the Crown, by the form of the loyal toast –

"The Queen, Duke of Lancaster"

The January 23rd meeting, featured a New Year message from the Lord Mayor of Manchester, Councillor Abid Latif Chohan.

The Lord Mayor gave us information about his background and role as Lord Mayor of Manchester.

The position of Lord Mayor is a ceremonial role and the position is selected from Manchester Councillors by the Queen. The position requires attending many events as well as welcoming international and royal visitors.

The Lord Mayor was born in a remote village in the Jhelum district in Pakistan's Punjab province and has lived in Manchester since 1998 with his wife Azra.

Councillor Chohan had undertaken a Bachelor of Laws qualification in Pakistan. Desiring to continue his career in law in the UK, Abid went on to pass a Qualified Lawyers Transfer Test in 2006 - a regulatory exam for foreign licensed attorneys who want to practise in England and Wales.

Abid has his own law firm, is the founder and Chair of the British Pakistani Cultural Association, supports a number of charities, and is an active trade unionist.

He was elected to Manchester City Council in 2004 where he has served as Lead Member for Race and Equality and has sat on a number of scrutiny committees including Children and Young People, Communities, Neighbourhoods and Environment, and the Planning and Highways Committee. He has also sat on the Licensing and Appeals Committee for several years and served as Deputy Chair for four years.

Abid is interested in issues of poverty and youth and is committed to eliminating child poverty in Manchester.
