

IN MEMORY OF PP ERNIE JOHNSTONE PHF



Ernest was a member of our Club from 1984 to 2016 and our President 2001-2002. I was his Club Secretary.

Occasionally someone will do something extraordinary in Rotary. When Ernest announced, at the beginning of his year, that he had booked the Bridgewater Hall for a brass band concert, some of us wondered what he had been taking. But this is what he did.

On his own initiative he booked the Black Dyke Mills brass band and the Honley Male Voice Choir from Huddersfield. This is one of the most famous brass bands in the world. The concert was a great success and the profits were enough to buy 2 motorised wheelchairs at a cost of about £4000 each. It was a courageous undertaking and it says a lot about Ernest as a man and a Rotarian.

As soon as he joined us, he was deeply involved in Rotary activities. Everything to do with sport and the outdoors appealed to him. He was a keen golfer and became both captain of our golf society and chairman of the rambling section. He was a regular attender at our Lakeland Weekends and even survived sharing a room with myself.

His Rotary work also extended to our senior's clubs. He often attended with his wife Joan, and as we all know Joan is a stalwart of Manchester Inner Wheel. Her constant support was a tremendous help during his Presidential year.


Ernest was not a flamboyant character and often kept his opinions to himself. Yet he had the ability to sum up a situation, when needed, with a few well-chosen words direct to the point. He wasn't offensive in any way, but forthright and honest.

He was kind; he was generous, and he cared about others and very much about Manchester Rotary Club. After he left, he continued to support us through his subscription to the Charity Draw and was a constant attender at the Fellowship Dinners, even when his health deteriorated.



I am sure we will remember Ernest with great fondness. It was a pleasure to know him. Maybe the biggest tribute we can pay him is to say" he was a very good Rotarian". Our Club was the better and richer for his membership. We need more like him. Thank you, Ernest for joining us.

Our March 12th meeting was highlighted by a presentation by Kate Puc from Francis House, followed by a cheque presentation from our club to support Francis House. This was a result of our annual Arndale Centre collection, with the assistance of the Greater Manchester Police Male Choir.

Kate explained to us that Francis House is a local children's hospice in Didsbury. It is a home away from home, for the whole family and not just the child.

As well as the main building, there is also a lodge for teenagers, which gives them independence with support. They also provide 'rainbow rooms' that assist families with grieving.

Francis House needs £4.7 million per year with only 12% of the funding coming from central government, the remainder derived from private funding.

Francis House was to have an Open Day on May 18th, which is currently postponed, due to Covid-19.

Summer Camp

18th July - 1st August 2020

A Camp where all the young people arrive as strangers and leave with lasting memories and lifelong friends.

Plans are now underway for the 2020 International Summer Camp to be held at Petty Pool Outdoor Centre at Sandiway near Northwich. A total of 14 overseas visitors will be invited to spend two weeks here as guests of our Rotary District. Already we have had applications from Rotary Youth Exchange officers in countries who have never previously sent students to our Camp.

As in previous years home hosts are sought who can look after either one or two young people aged between 16 and under 18 once they arrive in Manchester on Saturday 18th July until they go to Petty Pool on Wednesday 22nd July, and also for one further night at the end of the Camp on Friday 31st July before all the campers return home.

On Sunday 19th July there will be a Get Together Brunch to which all visitors and their host families are invited. A Welcome Barbecue will be held on Wednesday evening 22nd July and a Final Barbecue and Presentation evening on Friday 31st July, both at Petty Pool, again to which all host families are invited.

Other than the Get Together Brunch the programme for the home hosts is entirely free – none of the visitors will have been to England before so all will be eager to see the sights around our area.

All home hosts will need DBS certification to comply with current legislation and Rotary guidelines. This can easily be arranged if not already in place.
